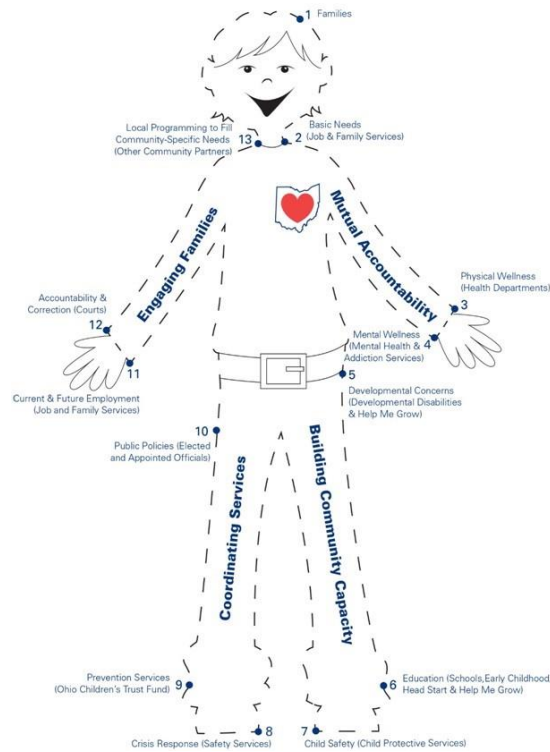


How We Work

We start with the family. Families are the center of our work and are active participants in the service planning and decision-making process. Our ultimate goal is to enable families to function independently of the system and increase their ability to be self-sufficient.

We take a personalized approach in building a unique treatment plan based on a foundation of the individual family's strengths. This plan is also centered around respect for the cultural, racial and ethnic differences of the families we serve.

Our work is results-oriented. We employ ongoing evaluations of outcomes to ensure effectiveness. We believe that effective coordination of services for our families includes delivery of high quality services that reduces and eliminates duplicative efforts among agencies and barriers to collaboration, integrates community and family supports, and full utilization of funding resources.



WE CONNECT THE DOTS.

Meigs County Family and Children First Council connects the dots to eliminate redundancy and bring resources together for planning, monitoring, and improving outcomes for families and children.

- **Service Coordination:** Program for children 0-21 receiving services from multiple child serving systems.
- **Early Intervention:** Service coordination, evaluation, and assessment for children birth -3 with developmental delays and/or disabilities.
- **Youth MOVE:** Council for youth and young adults ages 14-24 who have experience in youth-serving systems.
- **Community Planning and Cross-Systems Initiatives:** Bringing together partners that serve children and families to exchange information, identify areas of need, and collaborate on initiatives.
